The basic unit of academic work is the "full course credit" (1.0). During the Winter Session (approximately 26 weeks), the full course credit represents three full class contact hours or equivalent per week plus laboratory and/or supplementary instruction as required. Summer Session full course credits have equivalent workloads but are concentrated into a shorter period of time.

It is suggested that a full course credit is equivalent to six semester, nine or nine quarter hours. As is noted, however, that courses that are concentrated could yield the equivalent of eight semester hours or twelve quarter hours.

CONTENT OF TRANSCRIPT
